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
## **Key Achievements**










### **Client Ethnicities**










## **Deprivation Scrores**



The client was originally suffering from severe back pain. The pain was so severe that he is unable to walk at all some days. After just over two years of waiting for surgery, he was finally given an operating date at St Georges.

On the morning of the surgery, he was given devastating news by the surgeon who was due to operate on his back. He was informed that they were unable to carry out the scheduled operation that day as they had just looked at his blood reports and unfortunately, he has Cancer.

The client resides in Worcester Park in the Royal borough of Kingston. After contacting me, I have provided A.P with continued support which includes attending all hospital appointments with him. A.P has requested that I be present with him at every appointment as at times he doesn't fully comprehend what is being said to him by doctors. He also finds it comforting that I am around when his emotions get the better of him and he gets very angry and agitated.

I have not only connected A.P to local groups and sign posted him to the relevant support, but I have also been there to provide 1-1 support either face to face as well as over the phone. We often have wellbeing calls every week.

A.P has recently had his back surgery, which unfortunately has not been successful, and I have again been there with him at each step even visiting him at hospital to provide him with food and moral support.

A.P has been through a roller-coaster journey, and we have agreed for him to share his journey and experience and to share the learnings from it at our upcoming Wandsworth Cancer conference and hopefully inspire others that are on a similar path.

### Looking ahead

# **Next quarter**October - December 2024

Looking ahead to the next quarter, we will strengthen our partnership with St George's Hospital. After a recent meeting, they have requested case studies from our communities where patients have faced barriers, challenges, or negative experiences. These stories will be re-enacted by actors for the hospital's medical teams, who will respond to the scenarios in real-time. Afterwards, the teams will view a video of the actual patients sharing how the experiences impacted their treatment and what could have been done differently. We believe this will be a powerful training tool for medical staff.

St George's also provides monthly well-being sessions on topics like post-surgery fatigue and neuropathy, which we are working to extend to a wider audience. We are coordinating with organisations in Kingston and Richmond to stream these sessions live, allowing local residents to attend remotely and engage with medical professionals in real-time. The next session is scheduled for 18th November.

We are also collaborating with Claire Knight from Kingston Hospital to develop a more inclusive programme for BME cancer patients. Claire has identified gaps in services, and we will be working together to address these issues.

In November, I will present at an ARCC Wellbeing event, delivering a cancer awareness session entirely in Bengali to better engage attendees from the Bangladeshi community. This will enhance understanding and encourage questions in their native language.

Additionally, in December, we plan to host a focus group event with the South Korean Association, which has over 80 members. I have also connected with Kala, who runs a non-profit for Sri Lankan/Tamil cancer patients, and we will work together to support that community around New Malden.

Lastly, we are moving forward with our second conference in Wandsworth on 28th November and starting preparations for the third. Our 'Voices and Vision' forms will also be a key focus as we gather data and insights directly from the community, and continue our regular activities such as steering groups, focus groups, and community outreach. We are also progressing with the design of our booklets, which we hope to have developed and printed soon.









#### Looking ahead

Hosting a focus group with the South Korean Association in December (80+ members).

Partnering with Kala's non-profit to support Sri Lankan/Tamil cancer patients in New Malden.

Preparing for the second Wandsworth conference on 28th November, and beginning planning for the third.

Focusing on 'Voices and Vision' forms to gather data directly from the community.

Progressing with booklet design for development and printing.
